COST OF INTERNSHIP

We ask that you contribute to the cost of your internship through Mission Waco. You are encouraged to involve your local faith community in sending you to serve and grow this summer! They do this through their prayer and financial support to Mission Waco's mission. We will work with each intern in the process of raising the money. All costs are subject to Mission Waco's guidelines and policies and are fully discussed during the interview process.

The intern program costs Mission Waco about \$2000 per intern (for 2010) and includes: free housing, \$75/week per diem (up to 10 weeks) for food/misc, staff time for supervision and training, and learning experiences and materials. Interns who successfully complete the summer internship and fundraising goal are also provided a scholarship (up to \$250) to attend the Christian Community Development Association conference in the following fall (usually in the Fall in a major U.S. city).

Some need-based internship scholarships are available from Mission Waco.

Some interns are sent to Mission Waco by various denominational organization partners or grants that provide full or partial funding -- if this is your situation, please notify us when you apply for the internship so we may discuss your specific situation. Stipends may differ from above depending on the funding.

The letters of reference should address the following information:

- A. How long they have known you and the context of your relationship;
- B. Their views regarding your strengths and weaknesses;
- C. Their views regarding your maturity (emotional, relational, spiritual, leadership, work ethic, cross cultural relationships, etc. as it applies to the context of your relationship with them); and
- D. Whether or not they would recommend you to participate in an inner city urban ministry internship where you will be expected to:
 - 1. Create and implement your own personal holistic learning goals (we'll provide instruction on the learning goal process)
 - 2. Complete written assignments and participate in discussions regarding the content of the program (from classes on urban ministry topics, books, scripture reading, experiential activities, etc.)
 - 3. Become emotionally available to participants, peers, and supervisors during the learning process (i.e. not shut down emotionally when confronted or in a conflict, be willing to confront or express feelings in conflict, etc.);
 - 4. Help and lead in various programs that empower the poor and marginalized and/or mobilize the middle class. Depending on your volunteer work assignments, these programs include children, youth and/or adults.
 - 5. Live and volunteer in a racially diverse, low-income neighborhood, and be willing to "immerse" yourself in the community during the internship by building relationships with program participants, neighbors, staff and other interns outside of program hours.

MISSION WACO - SUMMER INTERNS

General Job Description and Expectations

Christian students or adults 19 years of age or older, who desire to experience ministry among the poor and marginalized, are welcome to apply for an internship.
(There are also regular volunteer opportunities for those who would like to help and serve without the extra responsibilities/requirements of the internship. Contact us if this is a better fit for you at this time.)

MISSION WACO WILL:

- 1) Provide housing and basic utilities, plus a weekly (approx 10 weeks) per diem of \$75 for food/misc for full time (40+ hours per week) work in the ministries and programs. Some food, plus all telephone, car expenses, and other incidentals will be paid by the intern. Interns who successfully complete the 10-week internship and fundraising goal may also request a \$250 scholarship to offset expenses for attending the annual CCDA conference in the fall. (Note: per diem and CCDA scholarship may not apply for interns funded by outside grants or organizations – check with us if you are unsure.)
- 2) Provide a weekly time for training and discussion, volunteering opportunities, supervision. Reading materials will be provided.

INTERN WILL:

- 1) Volunteer at least 40 hours per week, except for designated days off, in the various programs and ministries of Mission Waco.
- 2) Attend scheduled staff, intern, and supervisory meetings. Meetings may include open discussions, personal dilemmas, challenges, etc. Interns are expected to approach this time with a learning attitude.
- 3) Read assigned books, articles, and do any assigned research.
- 4) Seek to build cross culture relationships during and outside of volunteer work assignments.
- 5) Contribute to the cost of your internship through Mission Waco (see details elsewhere in application).

DAYS OFF:

- 1) Every attempt will be made to schedule each intern with one full day a week in which they are free not to be present at any programs or ministries. Although a specific day will be designated, schedules may periodically require change. The workday will vary for each intern as Mission Waco program schedules vary between the early morning, day time, evening, and weekend hours.
- 2) Interns are allowed one vacation day off for each full month worked (2 days for summer interns). Request of that day should be made in writing at least two weeks in advance. Approval or disapproval will be given within 72 hours. On weeks where seven days of full time work are required, the Director or Intern Supervisor will provide additional days off to offset some of the extra requirements.
- 3) Sick days and family emergency leave are negotiable. If an inordinate amount of time is used, termination may be required.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Interns may be expected to work in all programs or activities of Mission Waco. However, general assignments will dictate a significant amount of intern time.
